202. ELIGIBILITY OF NONRESIDENT STUDENTS	
1. Purpose	The Joint Operating Committee shall operate A. W. Beattie Career Cente for the benefit of students resident in the sending districts who are eligible for attendance.
2. Authority SC 1850.1 Articles of Agreement SC 1302	The Joint Operating Committee may permit the admission of nonresident students in accordance with terms of this policy. The Joint Operating Committee shall require that appropriate legal documentation showing dependency or guardianship or a sworn statement or residential support be filed with the Board Secretary before an eligible nonresident student may be accepted as a student in A. W. Beattie Career Center. The Joint Operating Committee shall not be responsible for transportation to or from school for any student residing outside school district boundaries.
SC 1316, 1847, 2561	Tuition rates shall be determined in accordance with statute. Tuition shall be charged monthly, in advance of attendance.
3. Guidelines	<u>Nonresident Children Placed In A. W. Beattie Career Center</u>
SC 1305	Any child placed in the home of a sending district resident by a court or government agency shall be admitted to A. W. Beattie Career Center and shall receive the same benefits and be subject to the same duties as resident children.
SC 1306-9 Title 22	<u>Inmates Of Institutions</u> A child who is an inmate of an institution for the care or training of children located within the sending district is not a legal resident of the district by such placement; but she/he shall

<p>Sec. 11.18</p>	<p>be admitted to A. W. Beattie Career Center, and a charge shall be made for tuition in accordance with statute.</p> <p><u>Juveniles Incarcerated In Adult Facilities</u></p>
<p>SC 1306-2 (a) 1318</p>	<p>A juvenile who is eligible for educational services and is confined to an adult local correctional institution following conviction for a criminal offense shall receive educational services from A. W. Beattie Career Center in the same manner and extent as an expelled student.</p>
<p>SC 1306-2 (a) 1901</p>	<p>A juvenile who is eligible for educational services and is confined to an adult local correctional institution following a charge for a criminal offense shall receive educational services from A. W. Beattie Career Center in the same manner and extent as a student placed in an alternative education program for disruptive students.</p> <p><u>Future Residents</u></p>
<p>SC 1316</p>	<p>A Student eligible for attendance whose parent has executed a contract to buy, build or rent a residence in the sending district for occupancy by September 15th may be enrolled with payment of tuition for three (3) weeks previous to the anticipated date of residency, at the beginning of the school year, provided that the anticipated date of residency is not later than September 15th of the same school year.</p> <p>If the student does not become a resident of the sending district by the end of the period for which reduced rate tuition is charged, tuition shall be required until residency is established.</p> <p>Parents of students who claim admission on the basis of future residency shall be required to demonstrate proof of the anticipated residency.</p> <p>The Joint Operating Committee reserves the right to verify such claims and to remove from school a nonresident student whose claim is invalid.</p> <p><u>Former Residents</u></p>
<p>SC 1316</p>	<p>Regularly enrolled students whose parents have moved out of the sending school district may be permitted to finish the semester with payment of tuition.</p>

<p>SC 1302</p>	<p><u>Other Nonresident Students</u></p>
<p>4. Delegation of Responsibility</p>	<p>A nonresident student may be admitted to sending district schools without payment of tuition where attendance is justified on the grounds that the student lives full-time and not just for the school year with district residents who have assumed legal guardianship of the student.</p> <p>The Executive Director or designee shall develop procedures for the enrollment of nonresident children which:</p>
<p>POL. 103</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Admit such students only on proper application and submission of required documentation by the parent or guardian. 2. Do not exclude any eligible student on the basis of race, creed, color, gender, sexual orientation, national origin, ancestry, or handicap/disability. 3. Verify claims of residency.
