221. DRESS AND GROOMING	
<p>1. Purpose</p>	<p>The Joint Operating Committee (JOC) recognizes that each student's mode of dress and grooming is a manifestation of personal style and individual preference.</p>
<p>2. Authority Title 22 Sec. 12.11</p> <p>Title 22 Sec. 12.11 (c)</p>	<p>The Joint Operating Committee will not interfere with the right of students and their parents to make decisions regarding their appearance, except when their choices affect the educational program of the Career Center or the health and safety of the students or others.</p> <p>Students will be required to wear certain types of clothing while participating in Career Center programs that have an industry standard for clothing, extracurricular activities, or other situations where special attire may be required to ensure the health or safety of the student.</p> <p>Students in certain Career Center programs shall be required to wear:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A. Protective Safety Glasses B. Safety Shoes/Gloves C. Hard Hats D. Hair Nets/Caps E. Beard Guards F. Ear Protection G. Safety Shields H. Respirators
<p>3. Delegation of Responsibility</p>	<p>The JOC authorizes the Executive Director or designee to enforce Career Center rules prohibiting student dress or grooming practices which:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Present a hazard to the health or safety of the student him/herself or to others in the Career Center. 2. Materially interfere with Career Center work, create disorder, or disrupt the educational program. 3. Cause excessive wear or damage to school property. 4. Prevent the student from achieving his/her own educational objectives because of blocked vision or restricted movement.

221. Dress and Grooming

The Principal shall be responsible to monitor student dress and grooming in the Career Center.
